Officials dedicate Sandusky City Hall on Meigs Street on May 4, 1958. During a ceremony, the Sandusky High School Band accompanied Pamela Mielke as she sang “The Star-Spangled Banner.”

Officials dedicated Sandusky City Hall on Meigs Street on May 4, 1958. Master of ceremonies for the dedication was John LaFene. A mobile studio from WLEC Radio was on hand to broadcast the event. Several local policemen stood at attention in front of the building.

Representatives of AMVETS Post 17 presented an American flag to ex officio mayor Stuart Gosser, and the American Legion presented the Ohio flag. Longtime state legislator Ethel Swanbeck also attended the event. The Sandusky High School band accompanied Pamela Mielke as she sang “The Star-Spangled Banner.” After the flag-raising ceremony, more than 100 city employees conducted guided tours of the newly dedicated building.

The former City Hall was located on Market Street. That building, which began as the Sandusky’s Central Police and Fire Station building in 1890, served as Sandusky’s City Building from 1915 until 1958.
