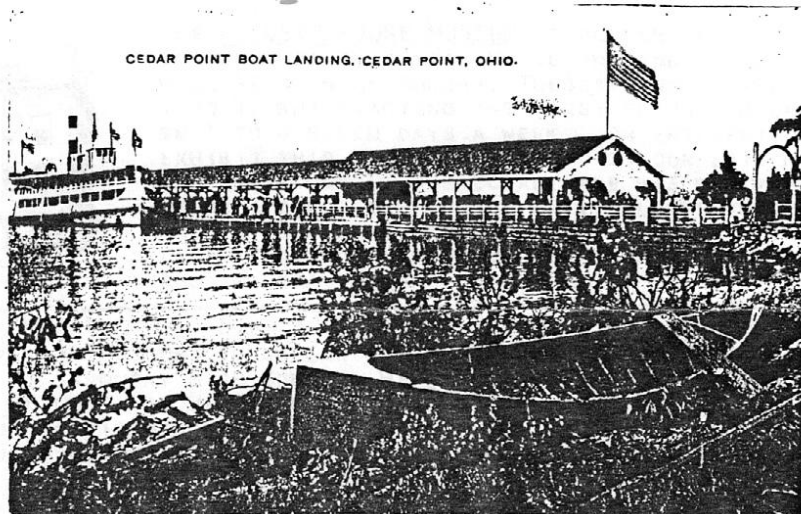

AT OUR MARCH MEETING, THE MEMBERSHIP VOTED TO USE SOME OF THE ROSINO FUND INTEREST FOR HISTORIC MARKERS. THE FIRST MARKER WE ARE PURCHASING IS FOR THE CONCRETION IN EAST WASHINGTON PARK. IN DECEMBER, THE STONE WAS PUT HALF-WAY INTO THE GROUND TO PREVENT FURTHER DETERIORATION. THE BRONZE PLAQUE WILL BE MOUNTED ON A STONE BASE. THE PLAQUE WILL BE DEDICATED DURING THE JULY 4TH CEREMONIES AT THE GAZEBO. FOR FURTHER DETAILS, WATCH THE NEWSPAPER.

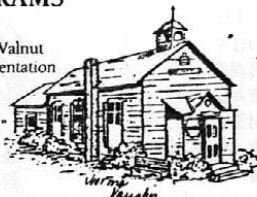
THE FOLLETT HOUSE MUSEUM IS ALL SHINED UP AND READY FOR ANOTHER BUSY YEAR. UNTIL THE END OF MAY, THEY WILL BE OPEN ON SUNDAY, TUESDAY AND THURSDAY FROM 1 TO 4, BUT STARTING THE FIRST OF JUNE HOURS WILL BE 1 TO 4 SEVEN DAYS A WEEK. AN INTERESTING NEW EXHIBIT THIS YEAR WAS DONATED BY OUR LATE MEMBER WILBERT SCHWER. A SPECIAL CASE WAS BUILT TO HOUSE A COLLECTION OF SEVENTY PLANES WHICH WERE MADE BY THE SANDUSKY TOOL COMPANY. ALSO IN THE CASE IS A GROUP OF PICTURES OF THE TOOL COMPANY AND INFORMATION ABOUT IT.

TO STEP FROM MUSEUMS TO GALLERIES, THE NEW SHOW AT THE CULTURAL CENTER AT SANDUSKY HIGH SCHOOL, HENRY KELLER'S SUMMER SCHOOL AT BERLIN HEIGHTS, IS WELL WORTH SEEING. THE PAINTINGS BY KELLER AND FOUR OF HIS STUDENTS, DONE IN THE EARLY 1900'S GIVE A DELIGHTFUL PICTURE OF THE AREA AT THAT TIME. THE CENTER IS OPEN FROM 1 TO 4 SUNDAY THROUGH FRIDAY AND THE SHOW WILL RUN THROUGH MAY 26.

THE FIRELANDS COUNCIL OF HISTORICAL SOCIETIES IS SPONSORING A TOUR OF KELLEY'S ISLAND ON SUNDAY, JUNE 30. KEVIN PAPE, WHO WAS IN CHARGE OF THE HISTORIC INVENTORY OF THE ISLAND, WILL CONDUCT THE TOUR AND GIVE A LECTURE. THE ISLAND IS UNIQUE BECAUSE THE WHOLE ISLAND IS AN HISTORIC DISTRICT ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER. THIS IS LARGELY DUE TO KEVIN'S EFFORTS. ASSEMBLY AT THE VILLAGE HALL ON DIVISION ST. IS AT 2:00.
